






Going to College

Your next steps- Information guide for Year 11 students and parents

This booklet has been created to help Year 11 students and parents understand possible next steps at the local colleges: <u>Cirencester College, Hartpury College and South Gloucestershire & Stroud College (SGS).</u>

We will explore the steps that are available for both those who have already applied and what to do if you have yet to apply. The last page will also provide a variety of useful links, for both the colleges and impartial websites to help with your research. This helpful infographic* helps to illustrate your options after each step of the student journey. Different schools and colleges will be able to provide not only different courses, but also different types of qualification to suit your needs.

Different qualifications will suit different people- for example, for those who prefer to be hands on with their learning, <u>BTEC</u> qualifications or <u>Apprenticeships</u> may suit you.

However, if you prefer a more traditional, classroom-based style of learning, <u>A-Levels</u> may be your best route.

Haven't applied yet?

Don't worry – we are still accepting applications across all of our courses – just go onto our website <u>Initial Registration 2020 alt</u> | <u>Cirencester</u> <u>College</u> and complete your details – you will need to have your predicted grades and choose what you would like to study. Once you submitted your application you will receive a confirmation email and within a few days one of our Admissions team will call you and confirm your choices so that we can offer you a place to start with us in September.

Not sure what you want to study?

Take a look at our Courses Pages on our website – each one will tell you all about the course, what and how you will learn and what you can go on to do after college – you can even search for relevant careers using the Pathfinder software. You can choose a combination of vocational and academic subjects and we have plenty of options for courses which you may not have studied before like Criminology, Media Production and Environmental Science.

Got your offer from Cirencester - now what?

After your call from the Admissions team, you will be emailed your offer, then go onto the Applicant Portal and accept it (don't worry – you can still change your mind about your courses)

<u>Communications</u>: We will send you regular updates both by email and by post.

<u>Transport:</u> All our bus services are run by Stagecoach and you can check your bus options and start saving for your season ticket. <u>Travelling To College</u> <u>Cirencester College</u>

<u>Financial Support</u>: We offer a very generous bursary scheme – see if you are eligible and apply here: <u>Financial Support | Cirencester College</u>

<u>Enrolment at College</u>: You will need to book your enrolment appointment at the College – we will email you to let you know when and this will be your chance to confirm your subject choices and ask questions about coming to college.

Flying Start/Summer Work: On the Applicant Portal you will find some Summer work for your courses. Doing this work will give you a great insight into the course you have chosen and will form part of your first grades.

<u>Results Day</u>: Once you receive your results you will need to upload them onto the Applicant Portal as soon as possible. If you haven't met the course requirements then we can discuss your other options when you come to your enrolment appointment.

Monday 6th September: Induction Day

Tuesday 7th September: Lessons Start!



Starting at College – what do I need to know?

<u>Learning Support</u>: If you have been receiving some extra support at school or if you feel you would benefit from some additional support then please let us know as soon as possible. If you have already let us know about any support requirements then our academic support department will be in touch over the summer.

<u>Pastoral:</u> We have an experienced pastoral team available to offer you any additional support you would benefit from. You will also have a Tutor assigned to you who will be your first point of contact if you have any questions.

<u>Buddy</u>: This year we are offering the option of a second year student to guide you around on the first couple of days to help you find your way about – please get in touch with us if you would like a buddy: schools.liaison@cirencester.ac.uk

Applied?

If you have applied, please keep an eye out on your emails for updates on your application and interview. All interviews will be completed over the phone. We aim to provide the results of the interview within two weeks, however for some of our courses, this may take a little longer, but you will be advised of this at interview stage. If you change any of your personal details at any stage, please get in touch with us as soon as possible.

Once you've received an offer at Hartpury College, this is what happens next:

1. Coming to Hartpury booklets-

You'll receive two booklets in the post. The first includes important information about joining Hartpury. The second shows you exciting opportunities inside and outside your course.

2. Accept your offer-

It's important to accept your offer as soon as possible.

3. Book your transport-

If you live in the local area, make sure you book as soon as you can, so we can ensure you have a space. Visit <u>www.hartpury.ac.uk/college-transport</u>

- <u>Apply for financial support-</u> Check if you're eligible for our bursaries and scholarships and apply. Visit www.hartpury.ac.uk/college-finance
- 5. June- Induction webinar-

Once you have an offer, you'll be invited to a webinar for your course. You'll meet lecturers and classmates and find out more about your course.

6. Mid-June- Your enrolment guide

You'll receive your guide in the post, which will include important information about your enrolment; what to do when you get your GCSE results, what happens at enrolment, kit lists and details of additional fees.

- Mid-July 2021- Enrolment details-We'll be in touch with more details about your enrolment, including the date and time for your course.
- <u>12 August 2021- GCSE results day-</u> Once you have your results, you must let us know as soon as possible.
- 9. <u>6-9 September 2021- Your enrolment on campus</u> We'll send you updates in July and August.



What if I don't get the grades I need for my course? Even if you don't think you have met the entry requirements, do get in touch with us and if we can offer you your course, or an alternative, we will let you know as soon as possible. <u>admissions@hartpury.ac.uk</u>

- 2. Complete your application form
 - You can apply online it is really easy and you will get an immediate acknowledgement email

3. Transition to College taster session

- Take part in course activities and meet your tutors, as well as other future SGS learners


4. Results Day




Going to College
